The X40+ and X50+ spreader range: even greater accuracy and convenience



X50+, spreading of ammonium nitrate

SULKY is developing its **X40+ and X50+** mounted spreaders. Two **new items of equipment** have just enhanced this range of spreaders, making them easier to use and improving performance levels:

- **A new rolling action cover** is available across the range on an optional basis. This equipment can be operated remotely from the cabin using hydraulics. This function helps simplify logistics operations at the loading stage, particularly when limited staff are available at the farm.
- **A central, hydraulically operated border deflector** is also available on an optional basis. This device supports spreading from the very edge of the field, with the flow shutter closed on the border side. Useful on prairies or with certain arrangements involving cereals, this deflector provides an additional solution to the problem of spreading at borders. The X40+ and X50+ range already features **the TRIBORD 3D border device as standard on the right side and as an option on the left** on ISOBUS versions. The TRIBORD 3D can be used from the tramlines and makes it possible to switch at any time from spreading with yield optimisation to spreading in environmental mode, without getting off the tractor.

The whole X40+/X50+ range is available in the ISOBUS version, particularly with the **new SULKY QUARTZ 800 terminal**. In any case, SULKY spreaders can be used with other ISOBUS terminals already present at the farm. **New types of compatibility between ISOBUS** and the universal terminals on the market are available for section control and rate adjustment functions: **Intelliview IV (NH), AFS (CASE), Tellus/Tellus GO (KVERNELAND), etc.**
